

Delta Vision Blue Ribbon Task Force  
June 26-27 Meeting  
Action Items

- (1) Calendar facilitated regional sessions as quickly as possible, even if locations are uncertain, to help TF members plan.
- (2) Ask DWR re status of additional analyses mentioned in report on conveyance.
- (3) Recommendations regarding development of staff drafts of the strategic plan (substantive comments were numerous and will be incorporated in future staff drafts):
  - Clearly label the draft strategic plans sequentially – “First Staff Draft,” “Second Staff Draft,” etc – and then “Final Adopted Strategic Plan.”
  - Communicate the importance of early suggestions for improvement in these drafts as the most effective contributions to the work of the Task Force.
  - Provide a table of contents for drafts.
  - Develop a more effective structure for presentation of performance measure targets
- (4) Analyze the interaction between ecosystem protection goals for Delta water flows and water available for human use, incorporating how a wet period diversion could be implemented.
- (5) Ensure that materials developed during the process of writing and revising the Strategic Plan are archived permanently on the web, and that an index of these materials is included in the Strategic Plan.
- (6) Organize a discussion of governance proposals among interested parties.
- (7) Ensure sufficient time on panel of California departments (DWR, SWRCB, DFG) for extended conversations.
- (8) Request to Elaine Archibald to provide latest figures on per capita water use for member agencies.
- (9) Request to R. Patterson, T. Birmingham, J. Duerig, and G. Zlotnick to provide detailed recommendations for improvements on each draft of the vision as early as possible.
- (10) Request to R. Patterson, T. Birmingham, J. Duerig, and G. Zlotnick to provide (individually) strategic levee investment plans for up to \$800 million.
- (11) Request to J. Duerig to provide CUWA letter to DWR identifying priority levees. (received)
- (12) Request to local governments panelists to submit comments on how they would improve each draft of the Strategic Plan., particularly the Delta as Place sections.

- (13) Request to all stakeholder panelists to submit comments on how they would improve each draft of the Strategic Plan, including how to reinforce comprehensiveness and linkages.
- (14) Develop and use a matrix of strategic actions to solicit interest group preferences and aversions.
- (15) Direction to staff to organize comments according to interest groups and topic.
- (16) Direction to staff to examine California Partnership for the San Joaquin Valley's latest recommendations as a possible template.
- (17) Draft a Task Force recommendation regarding bond language to be directed to the Governor and four legislative leaders.
